In one year, Maryland hospitals care for more than 5 million people—whether through inpatient admissions, emergency care, or outpatient services. From delivering 65,000 babies to treating about 1.1 million in emergency departments, hospitals are caring for Maryland 24/7/365.

Beyond the Bedside

Maryland hospitals don't just treat illness they build healthier communities. In fiscal year 2022, hospitals invested \$2.09 billion in community benefit programs, including access to health care, housing, food security, and transportation. These efforts tackle the root causes of poor health and advance health and health care for all Marylanders.

Backbone of Maryland's Economy

Employing over 223,000 Marylanders, directly and indirectly, hospitals contribute \$35 billion in economic impact every year. Many of these employees live and work in the communities they serve.
